Pre-K, Kindergarten, and New Student 1-8 Registration for 2019-2020

Registration for Pre-K, Kindergarten, and New Students 1-8 is still underway! Registration packets are available in the school office. Help spread the word!

Our Pre-K is geared for children who will be attending Kindergarten the following year. The curriculum is very similar to the Kindergarten program and is very strong in providing language experiences. (4 years old prior to September 30th). Our morning session includes a waiting list with spots still available in the afternoon session.

We offer both 1/2 day and full day Kindergarten. Our Kindergarten program strives to provide the child with a positive beginning to his/her formal education. (5 years old prior to September 30th).

New Student Referral Program

We recognize that our current school families are often our biggest cheerleaders. Thank you to everyone that submitted referrals this year. Because of your efforts, we provided numerous tours and welcomed many new students. Those referrals that qualified will receive their tuition credit on the next statement. The New Student Referral Program will continue for current Sacred Heart parents or guardians who are paying tuition for enrolled students (Kindergarten—through 8th grade). We will award a \$250 tuition credit to a current Sacred Heart family for each new student that is referred to, enrolls and attends Sacred Heart School. (Refer a family that enrolls two students and receive a \$500 credit, three students and receive a \$750 credit, etc.) **To be eligible for the New Student Referral Program, you must first fill out a Referral Program form BEFORE the family calls, inquires, tours and registers for school.** Forms are available in the school office, or on our school website. Sacred Heart of Jesus School is an EdChoice Expansion Provider. EdChoice Expansion is an income based, full tuition, scholarship and is open to students entering kindergarten, first, second, third, fourth, fifth, or sixth grade for Fall 2019. Survey

Joe Ozbolt, an alumnus of Sacred Heart who is in graduate school at Auburn University working on his Masters and Ph.D. in Mathematics. In that time, he met my wife, Melani Landerfelt, who is scheduled to graduate this year with her Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology. Her dissertation is about sleep patterns and sleep health among students who are 8-12 years of age (older 2nd graders to younger 7th graders). She is looking at differences among students who go to public school and private school and she is especially needing more participants who go to private school.

He is asking if it is possible for Sacred Heart students and parents to help her in her data collection. She is still very much in need of at least 40 more students from private schools in this age range to complete her survey. This 15-20 minute survey is to be completed by students who may ask for help from their parents if needed. It is also anonymous and has been approved by the Auburn University research board. She will also donate \$1 to a charity for every survey that is completed.
